Public Statement: Prohibition Order – Mr Jason Hagon

The Health and Community Services Complaints Commissioner (HCSCC), Associate Professor Grant Davies, has issued a [Prohibition Order](#) against southern suburbs massage therapist, Jason Hagon, after he pleaded guilty to 11 sexual assault charges against nine victims.

Over a two-year period, from April 2022, the HCSCC placed successive Interim Prohibition Orders against Mr Hagon, of Morphett Vale, when SA Police raised allegations that he assaulted two women when providing therapeutic massage services.

In June, Mr Hagon pleaded guilty in the District Criminal Court of Adelaide to 11 counts of indecent assault against nine women between 2009 and 2022.

All the offences occurred during massage therapy Mr Hagon provided to the women.

On this basis, the Health and Community Services Complaints Commission has finalised its investigation.

The permanent prohibition order commenced at 11.59pm on Thursday 1 August 2024 and will remain in place indefinitely.

Associate Professor Davies said the investigation found Mr Hagon had breached the [Code of Conduct for Certain Health Care Workers](#).

“I believe Mr Hagon’s services pose an unacceptable risk to the health and safety of members of the South Australian public,” Associate Professor Davies said.

“This ongoing order will have effect until varied or revoked and means Mr Hagon is no longer able to provide any health services covered by the Code”.
